City proposes dedicated carpark for NICU parents

Parents with babies in King Edward Memorial Hospital (KEMH) Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) could soon have dedicated hospital on-site parking if a proposal by the City of Subiaco is accepted by the State Government.

The City is proposing a City-owned car station on Hensman Road is turned into hospital patient and visitor parking in exchange for KEMH allocating one hospital carpark for the exclusive use of NICU parents.

The City currently provides the hospital with 20 parking permits each week that allow NICU parents to park all day for free but the City recently found the permits were not being utilised to their full capacity – largely due to low availability of nearby parking spots.

The proposal was approved by Council this week and comes after an extensive investigation by the City, including discussions with KEMH, Helping Little Hands, and NICU parents.

Currently, KEMH have 467 parking bays on-site with only 29 of these available for patients and visitors.

Hay Street reopen for business

The full extent of Hay Street is expected to open today for the first time since February, restoring traffic flow, foot traffic and additional street parking to the area.

The City is scheduled to remove the safety hoarding on Friday 27 August after the property owner, Sanur, has completed stabilisation works at 424-436 Hay Street that the City ordered them to undertake back in March.

Sanur appealed the order but last month the State Administrative Tribunal (SAT) ruled in favour of the City of Subiaco, upholding the orders which were to enable safe reopening of this arterial road.

"I'm exceptionally pleased that the City is able to fully and safely reopen Hay Street after months of suffering for local businesses," CEO Colin Cameron said.

"We've recently had some new businesses move into Hay Street with more on the way so I encourage everyone to come and support new and existing businesses in the area."

Rokeby Road South Streetscape Masterplan approved

The Rokeby Road South Streetscape Masterplan was approved at this week's Council meeting.

The masterplan addresses safety issues on Rokeby Road between Bagot Road and Thomas Street, while also enhancing the existing character and amenity of the precinct.

It was developed with extensive community consultation and modifications were made to the draft plan in response to matters raised by the community, including amending the proposed staging of the masterplan to further minimise long-term disruption to businesses.

Council gives green light for Rosalie Park upgrades

Rosalie Park is set to get a lighting upgrade and a new mixed-use sporting area, after Council gave the projects the green light at this week's meeting.

Existing lighting at the popular playing fields does not currently meet Australian Standards and community consultation showed 100 per cent of respondents in support of the upgrade. The project will be partially funded by a State Government grant.

The new sporting area is part of the City's fast tracked capital works program, and will include courts, cricket nets, a ping pong table, a garden, and more.

Both projects will not only bring infrastructure at Rosalie Park up-to-date but also deliver social and health benefits to the local community.

Mayor Penny Taylor said the upgrades were much needed. "Rosalie Park is a much loved and well-used park in our community," she said.
