COVID-19 update

The City's Administration Centre, Subiaco Library, Museum, Lords Recreation Centre and other community facilities, such as community centres and playgrounds, have now resumed normal opening hours with some capacity limits in place.

Some regular events will have reduced capacity or will not recommence until after restrictions have eased further.

If visiting any City facility or local business, please wear your mask, practise physical distancing, and follow the instructions for providing your details via the SafeWA App or physical contact register to help keep our community safe.

Mayor Penny Taylor said there was still lots to do in Subiaco during the post-lockdown transition period.

"Together, we can help play our part to ensure Subiaco continues to thrive. Shop local, wear a face-mask, check-in on the SafeWA app and use common sense to stay COVID-safe," she said.

"Stop by the library and choose your next read, take a class at Lords, picnic at one of our many parks, or take a walk to a local retailer before grabbing a bite to eat at a nearby café or restaurant."

Entries for the awards are open to all photographers in the Perth metropolitan area aged six years and over until 4pm Sunday 7 March.

There are three categories photographers can enter: mobile phone, Subiaco and open, with additional accolades up for grabs including youth and kid awards and a People's Choice Award.

Finalists' photos will be exhibited at Subiaco Library from Saturday 1 May to Sunday 30 May, during which time the community can vote on their favourite for the People's Choice Award.

Notice of reduced traffic flow on Hay Street

The section of Hay Street between Catherine Street and Rokeby Road has been reduced to a single lane of traffic flow.

The buildings are being monitored and assessed by a structural engineering firm. As a precautionary measure, until these further assessments are completed the footpath, parking bays and two lanes of traffic have been closed. Traffic has been diverted to a single lane, using the parking on the southern side of the road.

The City anticipates the extent of the closure can be reduced soon, dependent upon the structural engineering assessment.

The City is working with the building owners to ensure the safety of all, and regrets any inconvenience.

Council Meetings

The City anticipates the upcoming Council Agenda Briefing Forum (16 February) and Ordinary Council Meeting (23 February) will be held in-person in Council Chambers.

To allow for physical distancing, attendees will be limited but both the agenda briefing and meeting will be live streamed online so you can watch from home. The live streams will also be uploaded onto the City's Youtube channel so the community can watch at a later date.

If you are feeling unwell or have any symptoms - no matter how mild - we ask that you do not attend but instead get tested and stay home.

State Development Assessment Unit application

In 2020, in part in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Western Australian Planning Commission was granted temporary decision-making powers to determine proposals over \$20 million in metropolitan Perth, and over \$5 million in regional areas.

The State Development Assessment Unit (SDAU) is a dedicated team supporting the Western Australian Planning Commission with the lodgement and assessment of development applications, including consultation on these projects.

SDAU has received a development application for 385 Rokeby Road proposing a six-storey building with a mix of apartments and retail.
