A corner store celebrated

Hensman Road is a treasured and valued character streetscape, typical of a Subiaco street. However this street boasts a pot of gold. Sitting on the corner of Nicholson Road, an early inter-war era corner store is being lovingly restored and extended. Excitingly, the shop component will be re-activated, providing public access as per its original use.

Built circa 1922, this corner store helps to illustrate a suburban way of life that is no longer practiced in Subiaco. A century ago corner stores such as this one were sprinkled throughout Subiaco addressing the need for easy day-to-day access to perishables and general groceries. All at a time before supermarkets, household refrigerators, and the widespread use of motor cars.

Shelley is the owner of this historically significant place and understands the importance of its conservation and revitalisation.

"I was very drawn to the building from the first time I saw it. It was in dire need of repair but I could see its potential and knew I could play a part in bringing it back to life. The fact that it is nestled in a residential context has been a wonderful bonus and community support for the project from the outset has been incredible," Shelley said.

City to update active open space report

The City will seek an update of a report that details future requirements for active open space after a recent decision of Council.

The Cardno Report was done in 2016, outlining future requirements for sport space in the City; it recommended Subiaco Oval be retained for community sporting use to help address an under supply of active open space.

Council also recently decided to seek legal advice regarding a 2018 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City and the State Government relating to Subiaco Oval to investigate whether particular obligations have been met and, if they have not been, what options are available to the City.

Subiaco Mayor David McMullen said an updated active open space report would help strengthen the City's position when advocating for community priorities in this area.
