



Native plant subsidy scheme starts soon

The City has partnered with the Western Suburbs Regional Organisation of Councils (WESROC), to offer ratepayers up to eighty local native plants for their verge and garden at the subsidised cost of \$1.75 each.

As well as enhancing and supporting local biodiversity, native plants require little water or fertiliser once they're established. They also make for a beautiful garden or verge.

From Saturday 1 May, APACE Nursery in North Fremantle will be open for the scheme from 8am to 3pm Monday to Friday and from 8am to noon on Saturdays.

The scheme is limited to the month of May (or until stock runs out). Proof of residency is required.

Verge Valet

In line with the Waste Plan 2020-2025, the City is investigating the implementation of the Verge Valet Service (VVS) – a personalised collection service for residents in place of two bulk verge collections a year.

It would be run by the Western Metropolitan Regional Council and allow residents to book their two bulk waste collection dates when best suits them. The City would continue to provide its normal, weekly green waste collection service.

As well as being a more flexible and personalised service, VVS would help improve the appearance of streets and reduce illegal dumping by non-residents.
