

Ward and representation review recommendation

After an extensive community consultation process, the City is proposing to reduce its number of councillors from eleven to eight and adjust the ward boundaries.

This week, Councillors considered the findings of an independently run survey for the number of wards and councillors in the City and resolved to make a submission to the Local Government Advisory Board proposing the community's preferred option: retain four wards with adjusted boundaries, and reduce the number of councillors to eight (two per ward).

Community consultation was conducted between 16 October and 30 November 2020. The review was required to address an imbalance in representation ratios following the implementation of the City of Perth Act 2016.

These proposals will correct the uneven ratios of electors per ward, and ensure more equal representation across all four wards. If accepted, these would take effect from the October 2021 local government elections.

City to donate to bushfire appeal

The City will make a \$10,000 donation to the Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund to help those affected by the recent bushfires in the Perth Hills, after a decision at Council's latest meeting.

"While we know this donation won't bring back what these families have lost, we hope it will help to ease their financial burden and some stress during this difficult time," Subiaco Mayor Penny Taylor said.

The Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund has been activated to raise and coordinate donations to financially support the victims of the fires, with administration costs covered by the City of Perth to ensure that the maximum amount of funds can be distributed to the victims of the disaster.

Bike Plan 2021-25 endorsed by Council

The Bike Plan 2021-25 was endorsed by Council at this week's meeting. The plan identifies key opportunities to improve the City's cycling network and helps set priorities for future cycling infrastructure investment.

It also helps inform the City on how to best implement improvements for the benefit of all cyclists while being conscious of the potential impacts on the broader Subiaco community.

The community contributed significantly throughout the development of the plan and helped determine the priority ranking of each project.

The plan includes a number of projects across the City, including safety improvements for existing cycling infrastructure, Safe Active Streets and Bike Boulevards, and shared path extensions.
