Public and private spaces

Vulnerable or homeless people, including those sleeping rough, have the same right to be in public spaces as all community members.

Property owners have the right to ask those loitering, begging or sleeping rough to leave their premises. If this instruction is not followed, police can be contacted on **131 444** and may issue a 'move on' notice.

Community members can contact the City of Subiaco who work with local service providers to assist people to access appropriate support services.

Antisocial behaviour

Antisocial behaviour includes aggression, offensive language, street drinking, vandalism and similar behaviours. If you see someone behaving in this manner, contact police on **131 444**. Violent behaviour should be reported immediately on **000**.

Begging

Begging is not illegal in the City of Subiaco. If you are concerned for someone's safety or wellbeing, please refer to the support services listed at the end of this document.
