



# 2024 Craig Silvey Award for Young Writers

## Frequently asked questions

### **Is there a theme for the award?**

To encourage innovation and individual ideas there is no theme for this award.

### **Can I edit my student's story before entering it?**

All entries must be the sole work of the entrant. Stories should not be edited by parents or teachers. The judges will assess students on the quality of their writing

### **How should I submit my story?**

You can choose to submit a digital or physical copy of your story.

#### **Digital Submission:**

Fill in the online form and attach a copy of your work. Your entry is not complete until you have attached your work and due to large volumes of entries, staff are unable to follow up on entries that do not have an attachment.

#### **Physical Submission:**

To submit a handwritten entry, you will need to fill in and print the online form and submit this together with your story by post, or in person at Subiaco Library.

The closing date for all entries is Monday 12 August, 5.30pm

### **My class has completed a story-writing task. Can I enter all their stories in the award?**

If the entry is **the sole work of the student** and meets the entry requirements the story can be entered. However, the judges discourage teachers from entering a class set of stories on the same topic or with similar prompts. The award encourages innovation and creativity, and the judges are looking for entries which show these qualities.

### **I am eighteen years old and in my first year of university. Can I enter the award?**

The award is open to Western Australian school students in years one to twelve. University students or high school graduates are not eligible to enter the award.

### **My child is in pre-primary. Can my child enter the award?**

The award is open to Western Australian school students in years one to twelve. Pre-primary students are not eligible to enter the award.

### **My child is home-schooled. Can my child enter the award?**

Yes, providing your child lives in Western Australia and is studying in years one to twelve they can

enter the award.

### **Can I use Chat CPT or other AI software to provide a base for my work?**

No, as part of the terms and conditions stories must be an original piece of prose writing. While you create the scaffolding AI software uses, the software pulls from other sources to create the work.

### **How can I get updates and reminders about the award?**

### **What details do I need to register my entry online?**

To register your entry online between Friday 19 July, 9.30am and Monday 12 August, 5.30pm and you will need the following information:

- author's name, age, gender, and school year
- contact information (email, phone, and postal address)
- title of the story and word count

### **Will I get my story back after I have submitted it?**

Due to the large number of entries received in the award each year entries cannot be returned. Entrants are encouraged to make a copy of their story before entering the award.

### **Who is Craig Silvey?**

[Craig Silvey](#) is the WA author of modern Australian classics including Honeybee and Jasper Jones, as well as his latest release Runt. He wrote his first novel as a YA author and is therefore a natural choice to lead this award and inspire the next generation of writers.
