Parking


Parking (including ACROD bays) are available outside the museum.

Otto Lipfert; his family and his taxidermy work

German born Otto Lipfert is our subject for this month's talk. Otto lived at 270 York Street, Subiaco in 1894 and became the WA Museum's first taxidermist. Otto's most famous work is the blue whale skeleton at the WA Museum which is named in his honour. Come and learn about his family's history and see his collection of taxidermy tools and drawings.
